

ORDINANCE NO. 980

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PARAGRAPH 1 OF  
SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 936 OF THE  
CITY OF EUREKA SPRINGS, ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Eureka Springs, Arkansas passed and approved Ordinance No. 936 on the 4th day of May, 1972; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Eureka Springs, Arkansas desires and deems it necessary and prudent to amend Paragraph 1 of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 936 to require surety bond only on the Treasurer of the City Tourist Promotion Commission, who shall be a Commissioner, and on the Executive Director of the City Tourist Promotion Commission and/or on the Manager of the City Auditorium, and not on each Commissioner of the City Tourist Promotion Commission as provided for in Paragraph 1 of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 936;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF EUREKA SPRINGS, ARKANSAS that Paragraph 1 of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 936 be and hereby is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

1. Commission Created.


The City Tourist Promotion Commission, hereinafter called "the Commission," is hereby created. The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) Commissioners who shall each be qualified electors of the City of Eureka Springs, Arkansas. Four (4) Commissioners shall be hotel, motel or restaurant owners or managers, and the remaining Commissioners shall be the Mayor and two (2) Aldermen of the City of Eureka Springs, Arkansas. The Commissioners shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City of Eureka Springs, Arkansas, such appointments being subject to confirmation by the City Council of Eureka Springs, Arkansas. The appointments of Commissioners shall be for terms of four (4) years, PROVIDED, however, the first four (4) Commissioners appointed by virtue of being hotel, motel or restaurant owners or managers shall serve for terms of one (1), two (2), three (3) or four (4) years with the term of each such Commissioner being determined by lot at the first meeting of the Commission. The remaining first three (3) Commissioners shall be appointed for terms <sup>concurrent with their respective election</sup> of ~~four (4)~~ <sup>terms of</sup> years. Successor <sup>office.</sup> Commissioners shall be appointed for the full term of four (4)

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years. In the event of a vacancy occurring on the Commission, it shall be filled by appointment by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the City Council of Eureka Springs, Arkansas. A vacancy will be deemed to exist when a Commissioner dies or resigns or ceases to possess any of the qualifications heretofore set forth by virtue of which qualifications such Commissioner was appointed. Each Commissioner shall file the Statement required by Acts 1971, No. 313, as amended by Acts 1973, No. 32 of the State of Arkansas, such Acts being compiled in ARKANSAS STATUTES ANNOTATED under Title 12, Chapter 30 thereof. The **Treasurer** of the Commission, who shall be a Commissioner, and the Executive Director of the Commission and/or the Manager of the City Auditorium shall each furnish to the City of Eureka Springs, Arkansas a Five Thousand and no/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollars surety bond that will serve to insure the City against misappropriation or mishandling of funds. The surety on said bonds shall be a reputable surety corporation. The premiums on such separate surety bonds shall be paid from the Eureka Springs Tourist Promotion Fund.
